Free Things to do in Las Vegas

Freemont Street – This place has it **ALL** from people watching to great music, to the Canopy Light Show, to Downtown Art – over 30 colorful murals and the Iconic Welcome to Vegas sign.

-Downtown Container Park has no entrance fee for The Treehouse, Playground, Pixel Room and Stage Area. You can wake up the Praying Mantis with a drum circle at sunset — he shoots flame from his antennae. (Closed on Mondays & Tuesdays) or "Lock in your Love" — take a lock with you and cement your relationship.

Bellagio – an 8 acre lake featuring water shows with lights and music with the water shooting up 460 feet in the air. Shows are every 15 minutes during the day and every 30 minutes at night.

- -See the World's Largest Chocolate Fountain at Patisserie. It's a 14' tall waterfall that circulates up to 2100 pounds of chocolate.
- -The Bellagio Conservatory is a great place for picture taking and changes 5x per year. The theme while we are out in Vegas is "Glam Menagerie: A Surrealist Summer:
- Gaze up at Dale Chihuly's "Fiori di Como" a 2100 sq. foot floral sculpture in the hotel lobby

Harrah's offers a free nightclub WITH NO COVER CHARGE! Carnaval Court @ Harrah's also does MULTIPLE free pours so you could end up with a free shot, they have a dance floor, music, and blackjack tables. There is also the "Big Elvis @ Harrah's" an epic free show. THIS IS A MUST SEE FOR ELVIS FANS...WADE FULLER!

Circus Circus offers FREE gambling lessons (as most casinos do – just check the casino website for types of gaming lessons offered as well as the schedule – it IS customary to tip your instructor) but they also have **FREE** circus acts on the main floor every hour on the hour.

The Wynn features "The Lake of Dreams" a free show starting every half-hour starting at dusk. This 3 acre parcel on the property has a 90 foot waterfall, 5500 lights, and 1500 palm trees. Go to the Registration desk for free balcony seating or follow the flowers and lights. It is a great photo op with the lights and carousel made of flowers – GO SEE AND SMELL THE BOTANICAL GARDENS.

A free "hideaway" Pool is located at MGM resorts at the Top Golf.

Sam's Town offers a Scenic Atrium with a forest, waterfall, lasers, lights, music, and animatronic animals.

Main Street Station has a RESTROOM (this is NOT a joke) where men can urinate on a piece of the ACTUAL Berlin Wall. Ladies – you CAN go inside and take pictures AFTER you ask security to clear the place out of men. This property also features an antique collection (2 minute walk from Fremont) such as Winston Churchill's **SNOOKER TABLE!**

Don't forget.... MOST casinos offer FREE gaming lessons. Go to their websites for schedules and games being offered. Tipping is CUSTOMARY to your instructor. I highly recommend lessons before playing a game that you have never tried before. Know what you are doing.

Walk the streets of Venice: The Grand Canal Shoppes at Venetian qualifies as one giant photo opportunity that offers guests a ¼ mile themed escape to Italy. (Note: The Rockhorse offers happy hour from 11am to 7pm Monday-Friday and you can score \$5 domestic drafts & \$5 well cocktails. Be sure to stop at the Tipsy Robot to watch robot bartenders)

All 1st timers should take in the themes of Paris, Luxor, Excaliber, New York New York, etc to experience the culture.

Pre-screen a show at MGM sponsored by CBS. As a thank you for your time (1 hour total, 45 minute showing with 15 minute survey) you get a coupon book.

The million dollar display is back at Binions after a years long hiatus. These are REAL bills and a great photo opportunity.

Hoover Dam – while it cost money for tours or parking, you can walk, view or drive over this piece of history.

Peruse the Coca-Cola store and check out the collection of unique Coca-Cola memorabilia on display. (Note: while not free, I urge you to try the soda sampler from around the world. It's eye opening what other countries find "good".)

Pieces of contemporary art are sprinkled throughout the Cosmopolitan. Their lobby features a digital display of 8 separate 15' tall pillars wrapped in

synchronized video screens creating interesting, almost disorienting illusions.

Play slots at Casino Royale. Sign up for a player's card and they will re-imburse your first \$20 in slot losses as free play. \$20 for \$20 is kind of free.

The Luxor – The World's Largest Inside Atrium. Fun Fact: The open space created inside the Luxor's pyramid weighs in at an impressive 29 million cubic feet.

Other Nature lover dreams can be found at 1) Blue Diamond located just outside of Vegas is an UNOFFICIAL town with 1 gas station, 1 school, and 1 restaurant. This scenic location is surrounded by mountains and offers hiking and wild burrows. 2) Seven Magic Mountains just off of I15 has 7 painted boulder totems with the highest being 35 feet high, no admission and free parking 3) Gold Strike Hot Springs offers a STRENOUS and maybe, dangerous hiking trail.

Want to see Mermaids while in Vegas? Go to the Silverton Hotel & Casino. The aquarium holds over 117,000 gallons of water and they have DAILY stingray feeding sessions. Shows are Thursday – Saturday from 12-1:15pm, 2-3:15pm, and 5pm-6:15pm. On Sundays show times are 10:30am-12:45pm, 2-3:45pm, and 5-6:45pm.

Area 51 is free and offers great photo ops. There are a lot of activities that cost money but they are very interesting. We received a free virtual tour in conjunction to the tickets we bought for a different activity. I love the Virtual glasses tours.

Not free but covers aren't going to break you: Clark County Museum - \$2 for Adults and \$1 for Seniors and Children Neon Museum:
